## L. EXCHANGE OF DIPLOMATIC AND CONSULAR PERSONNEL

The German Government has withdrawn the previously agreed safe conducts for future voyages of the S. S. Drottningholm between New York and Lisbon and has thereby violated the exchange This Government informed the Geragreement. man Government through the Swiss Government by note "that the German Government, by unilateral action, has violated the agreement entered into between this Government and the German Government for the exchange of their nationals in that it has withdrawn the safe conduct previously given for the several round-trip voyages of the Drottningholm between New York and Lisbon. As the assurance of this safe conduct was an essential part of the Exchange Agreement between the two Governments, this Government must consider the agreement as terminated by the act of the German Government."
